



Important Information

When doing sight words or writing, use whatever your child can work best with- pencil/paper, tracing in shaving cream, markers- anything you choose is fine. The goal is to just get your child to understand the letters "bat" in that order spell BAT.

If you would like to draw this unit out for the entire month of October- no worries! There is more than enough here to do that.

English-Split sight words, writing and reading into 1 choice per week. (ex: week 1 sight word BAT, week 2 writing BAT)

Math- increase to numbers to 1-5 and work on adding together to make 5 total.

Science- Go more into depth about the parts of a bat, what each part does and how it helps bats live better at night.

Soc Stud- Discuss other parts of the world where bats are common. Also, dive into fun kid friendly superstitions about bats from around the world.
